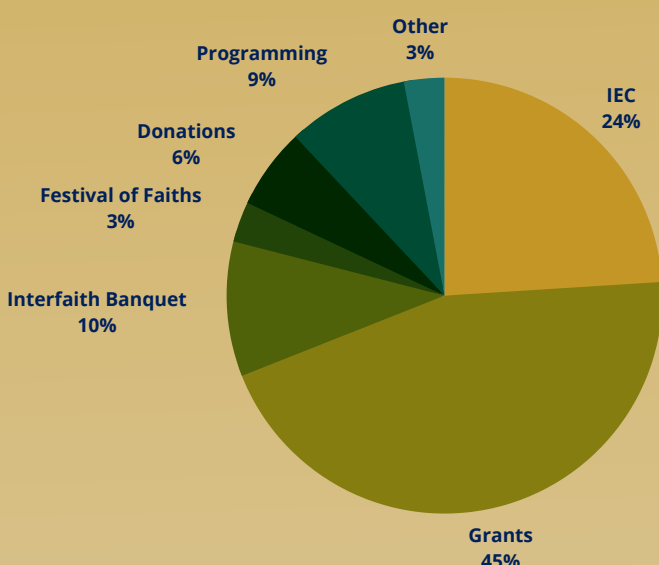

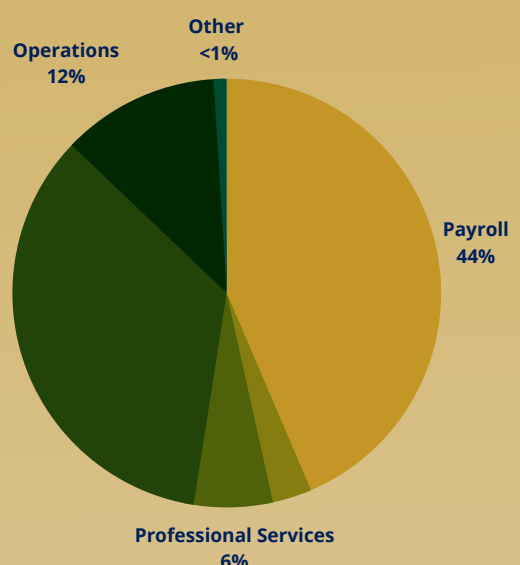

CIC is grateful for the dedicated Board of Directors and the diversity of the communities of which they represent. Over time, CIC has recruited 120+ religious and community leaders to serve on its board and established sustained bonds with the Sikh, Baha'i, Jewish, Christian, Muslim, Hindu, Jain, Buddhist, Pagan, and Agnostic communities in Central Indiana. Currently, CIC board members are 43% female, and 50% minoritized populations, with socio-economic levels ranging from those in the upper income bracket to those living monastic lives, with the majority in the mid to lower quartile of the economic scale.
